15 E-Learning Project

Thousands of frontline workers are due to undergo training in major emergency management under a new e-learning initiative launched by Dublin City Council, with plans to roll it out nationwide during the year.

21 Child Rescue Ireland

A new rapid response scheme for abducted children, recently launched in Ireland more than three years after getting the go-ahead, will be triggered if Gardai believe a child has been abducted and there is an immediate and serious risk to a child's health or welfare.

If 'A Vision for Change' is to become more than just a good policy, a National Director for Mental Health Services with clear authority and accountability must be appointed without delay, writes Orla Barry, Director of Mental Health Reform.

35 Great Garda Run 2012

Great Garda Run 2012 will see 103 members of the force take part in the Munich Marathon in October, in a bid to raise over €100,000 for Our Lady's Children's Hospital.

49 Healthcare Standards

The Health Information and Quality Authority has developed new national standards for safer, better healthcare, which will be launched at the end of June. They are the first step towards a licensing system for public and private healthcare providers.

55 Emergency Call-Outs

The introduction of fire and road safety awareness initiatives across Ireland in recent years has contributed to a dramatic reduction in the number of recorded fire-related deaths and emergency call-outs during the last five years.

58 EU Fire Officers Federation

91 Prisoner Ombudsman

Major gaps in accountability structures across Ireland's prison system were addressed by Northern Ireland Prisoner Ombudsman Pauline McCabe, who outlined the current culture of prisons north of the border at a seminar on 'Strengthening Accountability Behind Bars'.

99 Tetra Agency Day

Up to 100 key emergency services personnel, including Fire, HSE Ambulance, An Garda Síochána, Irish Coast Guard, Irish Mountain Rescue and Civil Defence attended Tetra Ireland's third annual Agency Day in April in Dublin.


