Having created a network of over 200 volunteer doctors to respond to lifethreatening emergencies in communities throughout Ireland since 2008, Irish Community Rapid Response now plans to recruit more medics over the next five years.

23 <u>Respond 2018</u>

Since the first National CFR Conference – RESPOND – was held five years ago, it has become one of the highlights of the year for community first responders and those seeking to improve the survival rates from cardiac arrest.

40 Paramedics on TV

Having returned to our screens recently for a third series, TV3's 'Paramedics' yet again went behind the scenes with the HSE National Ambulance Service, to give viewers a keen insight into the hectic routine of Ireland's frontline emergency medical service.

47 <u>Maynooth University</u>

The new MA in Comparative Criminology and Criminal Justice in Maynooth University's Department of Law provides students with the opportunity to develop a specialist knowledge of debates around crime causation and control.

49 Early Intervention

A network of evidence-based practice, advocacy and research organisations

across Ireland held a conference to address if Ireland could develop a model of prevention and early intervention to steer disadvantaged young people on the right path, similar to the approach taken by the city og Nottingham in the UK.

55 Irish Prison Service

The proliferation and power of gangs on the inside, in addition to the need to address the pending cycle of overcrowding by ensuring full capacity in the open centres and to reopen the Training Unit in Mountjoy, were high on the agenda at this year's Prison Officers' Association conference.

56 DRONE Search & Rescue

DroneSAR has become the first company in the world to develop software that can turn a commercial drone into a searchand-rescue platform, which the Irish startup aims will make a vital difference to first responders during SAR operations.

65 Security & Defence

Ireland's participation in PESCO – the EU body that aims to boost military cooperation – is voluntary, the decisionmaking remains in the hands of participating member states and there is no mutual defence clause. However, it remains a pesky issue, according to one security consultant.

70 <u>Air Ambulance</u>

Northern Ireland's first Helicopter Emergency Medical Service has carried out over 140 missions since its launch in July 2017. It now needs all-round support in Ulster to ensure that it continues to save lives on a daily basis.

76 Lifesaving Foundation

The Lifesaving Foundation and Waterford Institute of Technology have set up a new research partnership with the Gardaí, to investigate the concept of self-rescue in life-threatening situations.

79 <u>Hospice Heroes</u>

A number of 'Hospice Heroes' will take to the streets in June to raise funds for Hospice Sunflower Days, with every euro raised to be used locally to support the growing number of people using hospice and homecare services in Ireland.
